UPDATE BY DR. KALUMBI SHANGULA, MINISTER OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES ON COVID-19 IN NAMIBIA.

3 December 2020

1. Good afternoon fellow Namibians. Today, one hundred and twenty-two (122) new COVID-19 confirmed cases were identified from one thousand three hundred and thirty-three (1333) results received from the laboratories. This number represents a 9% positivity ratio, which is three times the ratio reported yesterday. The gender distribution of the reported cases is sixty-five (65) females and fifty-seven (57) males. The age range is from three (3) years to eighty-seven (87) years. The new COVID-19 cases are distributed as follows:

- 2. Among the 66 confirmed cases from Khomas region, eight (8) are from different educational institutions and two (2) are health care workers. The increasing number of new Covid-19 cases in the Khomas district is concerning and calls for extra precaution especially during this time when many people are preparing to travel during the festive season. The cases from other regions include nine (9) learners sporadically distributed across the districts, 1 health care worker from Tsumeb district and thirteen (13) employees from the fishing industry in Lüderitz district.
- 3. This significant rise in the number of confirmed cases across the country calls for extra steps to be taken. We re-emphasize to the general public the importance of observing COVID-19 prevention measures particularly as we approach the festive season. Wear a mask, wash your hands regularly, maintain social distancing and avoid gatherings.

4. Today we are reporting seventy-seven (77) new recoveries, with Karas region reporting the highest number of recoveries. This brings the total number of recoveries to 13 774.
