UPDATE BY DR. KALUMBI SHANGULA, MINISTER OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES ON COVID-19 IN NAMIBIA.

1. Good afternoon fellow Namibians. Today, one hundred and eighty-one (181) new COVID-19 confirmed cases were identified from one thousand five hundred and forty (1540) results received from the laboratories. This number represents a 12% positivity ratio. The gender distribution of the reported cases is ninety-eight (98) females and eighty-three (83) males. The age range is from one (1) year to seventy-five (75) years. The new COVID-19 cases are distributed as follows:

- 2. Today we are reporting confirmed cases from 10 (71.4%) regions, with 117 (66.9%) coming from Khomas region alone. Among the 117 confirmed cases from Khomas region, nineteen (19) are from different educational institutions of whom fifteen (15) are contacts of known cases and two (2) are health care workers. Of these 117 cases, 60 are contacts and 60% are symptomatic. The cases from other regions include twenty-one (21) learners of which seventeen (17) are from SI !Gobs Senior Secondary School in Omaruru district, three (3) healthcare workers, 2 from Omuthiya & 1 Nyangana district and five (5) truck drivers. Of all the sixty-four (64) cases from other regions, thirty (30) are contacts and 39% are symptomatic.
- 3. The significant increase in the number of confirmed cases across country is worrisome especially coming at the time when The President announced on Monday further relaxation of public health measures to combat Covid19. We do not wish to return to a situation when it becomes imperative to re-introduce restrictive measures. We have seen the hardships restrictive measures cause to the individuals, the livelihoods and the economy. I therefore call on the to adhere to COVID-19 prevention measures.

4. Today we are reporting hundred (100) new recoveries, with Khomas region reporting the highest number of recoveries. This brings the total number of recoveries to 13 874.

5. The total number of active cases currently stands at 775. Five (5) active cases are in severe to critical conditions of whom four (4) are in Khomas region and one (1) in Erongo region.
