UPDATE BY DR. KALUMBI SHANGULA, MINISTER OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES ON COVID-19 IN NAMIBIA.

5th October 2020

WINDHOEK

1. Good afternoon fellow Namibians. We have received 600 results. Of these, 28 samples tested positive for COVID-19, ten (10) males and eighteen (18) females. The youngest is eleven (11) years and the oldest is seventy-one (71) years. The confirmed cases are distributed as follows:

- 2. As I have informed last Monday, the laboratories are testing low numbers on weekends especially on Sundays. That explains the low numbers today. However, this should not give us a wrong message that COVID-19 is over. We encourage people to get tested so that when we report few cases, we know that we have really tested all that requires to be tested. This will inform the decisions being taken and will help us with tracking the trend of the COVID-19 situation in the country.
- 3. Today we are reporting 22 new recoveries. This brings the total recoveries to 9 451.
