UPDATE BY DR. KALUMBI SHANGULA, MINISTER OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES ON COVID-19 IN NAMIBIA.

6th October 2020 WINDHOEK

1. Good afternoon fellow Namibians. Today, we have received 458 results. Of these, 19 samples tested positive for COVID-19 which constitute 4.1%. Fourteen (14) are males and five (5) females. The ages range from eight (8) years to sixty-five (65) years. The confirmed cases are distributed as follows:

2. Today we are reporting 160 new recoveries. This brings the total recoveries to 9 611. The recoveries are distributed as follow:

3. The total number of active cases now stands at 1 937. Of the active cases, seven (7) are either in severe or in critical conditions.

- 5. I wish to clarify some measures related to travel. Entry into Namibia is open for Namibian citizens, permanent residence permit holders and people domiciled in Namibia. In addition, foreign nationals may enter Namibia for business, educational, health and tourism purposes, subject to public health measures. Non Namibians are required to present on entry a negative SARS-COV-2 PCR test result that is not older than seven (7) days. All persons entering Namibia, with the exception of tourists, are subject to a 7 days quarantine at own cost unless exempted.
- 6. It is said that repetition is the mother of learning. I would like to remind ourselves of some of the measures that are applicable in the post State of Emergency period. We are expected to practice social distance, and to wash hands and or sanitizing at all time. The wearing of masks in public places remains mandatory. The number of people present at any public gathering remains 50. I commend some churches who, despite the fact that the number of people at a public gathering was revised from 10 to 50, they voluntarily elected to remain at 10. This is commendable and demonstrates a high degree of responsibility.
