

The City of Windhoek promotes Windhoek as a safe tourism destination and we trust that you will enjoy your stay in our beautiful city. Guests' well-being and enjoyment are of paramount importance to us. Please help us ensure that your visit is both safe and pleasant by taking (as you would in any other city) the following simple precautions.

At the Hotel

 Leave your passport and other valuable documents, items and most of your cash in the hotel safe before going sightseeing.

Sightseeing and walking on the Street

 Avoid displaying jewellery, expensive cameras and other valuables. Carry your (video) camera in a shoulder bag and not around your neck.

- Keep your smartphone preferably on your person or in your pocket.
- Never leave your valuables or property unattended in any public place or displayed in the car even if you are on a guided tour.
- Never give money to street children or loiterers, as this is in contravention of Municipal by-laws.
- Learn about your surroundings.
 Ask the Tourist Information
 Officers and hotel staff.
- If you need a taxi, your hotel or the nearest Tourism Information Office can recommend a reliable transport service provider.

After Dark

- Most areas in the City are safe, but rather explore the in groups, especially after dark and on weekend afternoons when very few people are around.
- Stay away from dark and deserted areas. Seek advice from the Windhoek Visitor Information Offices on Independence Avenue and on Post Street Mall.
- Be on the lookout for signs displaying directions to these offices.

Safe Banking Tips

- Choose a well-lit ATM where you are more visible.
- Do not accept help from strangers, if possible rather ask for assistance inside a bank.
- Do not carry large sums of cash with you.
- Never let your card out of your sight or control at the ATM.
- Never let your card out of your sight when making payments.

- Ensure that you get your own card back after every transaction.
- Beware of card skimming as criminals use this method to steal your card information.
