We are the 2nd least densely populated country in the world with 2.2 people/Sq.Km., if you need social distancing then its better to leave home and use this opportunity to explore our own country.

A lot of the establishments have great specials on now for Local Namibians and many are not even sure if they will still be operational if the Covid-19 Outbreak will continue for another month or two. They have all taken complete precautions to ensure the safety and wellbeing of the patrons.

This is not a time to think if "Now we are suddenly good enough for these places", this is the time to show up and support them, they are fellow Namibians and Local businesses. Going to a lodge for a weekend with your family might mean that they wont have to retrench a couple of employees for yet another week, which in turn feeds their families and kids.

If you want to put things in perspective, with forecasted revenue of N\$26 Billion that our tourism industry would have brought in 2020, Namibia is instead losing N\$70,000,000 (N\$70 Million) EVERY SINGLE DAY.
